To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 1st day of December, 1909, creating Improvement District No. 9, and designating Fourth Street, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 28th day of September, 1910, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Fourth street, in said improvement district, as hereinafter described, by laying thereon Bitulithic pavement, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice

upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Fourth street, from the north line of Adams avenue, to the south curb line of "O" street or avenue. Notice is hereby further given that the Council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefitted by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$29,745.00.
