PROPERTY OWNERS OF ONE BLOCK PAYING ASSESSMENT.

Principal Portion of Adams Avenue Paving to be Assessed next Session.

While the main bulk of street improvement on Adams, Depot and Fir streets has not been assessed and the property owners have not been required to pay for any portion of the paving work already accomplished. the city officers are nevertheless getting a taste of what the Bancroft plan is going to bring about. One block on East Adams avenue near Willow street has been assessed and the property owners as a rule are adopting the Bancroft method of paying for the work. 
