London. Oct. 13-A dispatch from Paris to the London Globe today says the railroad strike has developed into a revolutionary struggle for the purpose of overthrowing the government. Bloodshed and rioting will be imminent and the scene is approximating the French Revolution. Blood demonstrations against the govern- pose. ment. Reports from Paris say 300 men and women engaged in a gun fight with the police today when the police attempted to break up a meeting of strike leaders at the office of the La Humanite, a socialistic newspaper. One woman and one soldier was reported killed and several wounded.

English Railroad Men Grumble.

With the approaching crisis in railway affairs in France, railway trainmen of England are showing noticeable signs of unrest. Not long ago the country was threatened with a big tieup of transportation lines. In many parts of England the men left their posts. Compromise measures however averted the trouble. Trainmen however are not now satisfied either with the hours or wages and the attitude of French railway men reflects the stand here.
