APPLE SHOW IS NEAR

Great Interest Attached to Coming

Spokane, Wash., Oct. 20 (Special)-Prof. H. E. Van Deman of Washington. D. C., who will preside as chief of the board of five judges at the third National Apple show in Spokane, November 14 to 19, believes the competitions will be keener than ever before for the prizes and premiums of a total value of \$20,000. He writes in a letter to Ren H. Rice, secretary and manager of the organization.
