### O. A. C. NEWS ITEMS

#### NEW PHYSICAL DIRECTOR SECURED FOR AGGIES.

General News Items of Interest From the Corvallis Institution.

Corvallis, Ore., Oct. 21 (Special)—C. E. Fisher, physical director of Grinnell college, Iowa, has arrived in Corvallis and will temporarily assume the duties of physical director at Oregon Agricultural college. Mr. Fisher is on a six months' leave of absence, and will be here until January 1, when he will resume his duties at Grinnell college.

Miss Mabel Woodberry, of Chicago, has been elected to an instructorship in the school of Music, at the Oregon Agricultural college. Miss Woodberry was a pupil of Sercik, Prague for five years and for two years assisted William Eylam at Berlin. Since her return to America she has spent a year at an institution at Lindborg, Kansas at the head of the violin department.

F. W. Grove, Jr., has been secured by the Oregon Agricultural college as instructor in Chemical Engineering. Mr. Grove is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin and has been associated with the International Pump Co. at Milwaukee, Wis.

F. E. Dobel, graduate of Depaw University of Illinois, has been appointed to the position of instructor in art. Mr. Dobel has been in active practice with Westinghouse, Church, Kerr & Co., New York, Supervising Architectural office, Washington D. C., and Spencer & Pokers, Architects, Chicago.

V. J. Safro, graduate of Cornell is the new research assistant of Entomology at Oregon Agricultural college. He will carry on the Adam's investigations relating to the effect of lime and sulphur spray upon fruit. For the past year Mr. Safro has been located at Dallas, Texas, in charge of the Boll Weevil investigations of the Bureau of Entomology and U. S. Department of Agriculture.

Clifton L. Flint, graduate of the Massachusetts Agricultural College, has been secured to succeed Prof. A. L. Peck, at Oregon Agricultural college. He will have charge of the floriculture and landscape work.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 477 SERIES 1910.

An ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder to enter into a contract with C. T. Darley for the building of a cement walk on Jefferson avenue from Fir street to Greenwood street. The City of La Grande Does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with C. T. Darley for building a cement sidewalk 12 feet wide on Jefferson avenue from Fir street to Greenwood street, for a price not to exceed the amount of his bid for said work.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer and after its approval by the Mayor shall take effect from and after the 22nd day of November, 1910.

Passed the Council on the 19th day of October, 1910, by six members voting therefor.
