BALLOTS REACH HUGE SIZE

NEARLY FOUR FEET LONG AND CONTAIN 138 NUMBERS.

Union County Voters to Have Enormous Ballot at Coming Election.

Three feet eight inches long, and fourteen inches wide are the dimensions of Union county's ballot for the general election in November. The ballot is now being printed—thirteen thousand of them—and will be ready for distribution to the various precincts of the county on time. Count-Clerk Ed. Wright has had a monumental task in preparing the copy and arranging it. Some idea of the enormity of the ticket can be gained when it is said that there are 138 places where the voter can cast his all powerful yes or no.

The ballot is by far the largest ever printed in Union county and it will not be surprising if the count is not completed in many of the precincts before the elapse of at least twenty-four hours whereas the count is usually closed about 12 hours after the polls close. The ballot would fill an entire issue of the La Grande Observer, but this paper will, for the convenience of the voters, publish the ticket "on the installment plan" prior to the election so that the voter can know just what he is going to face before he enters the booth.
