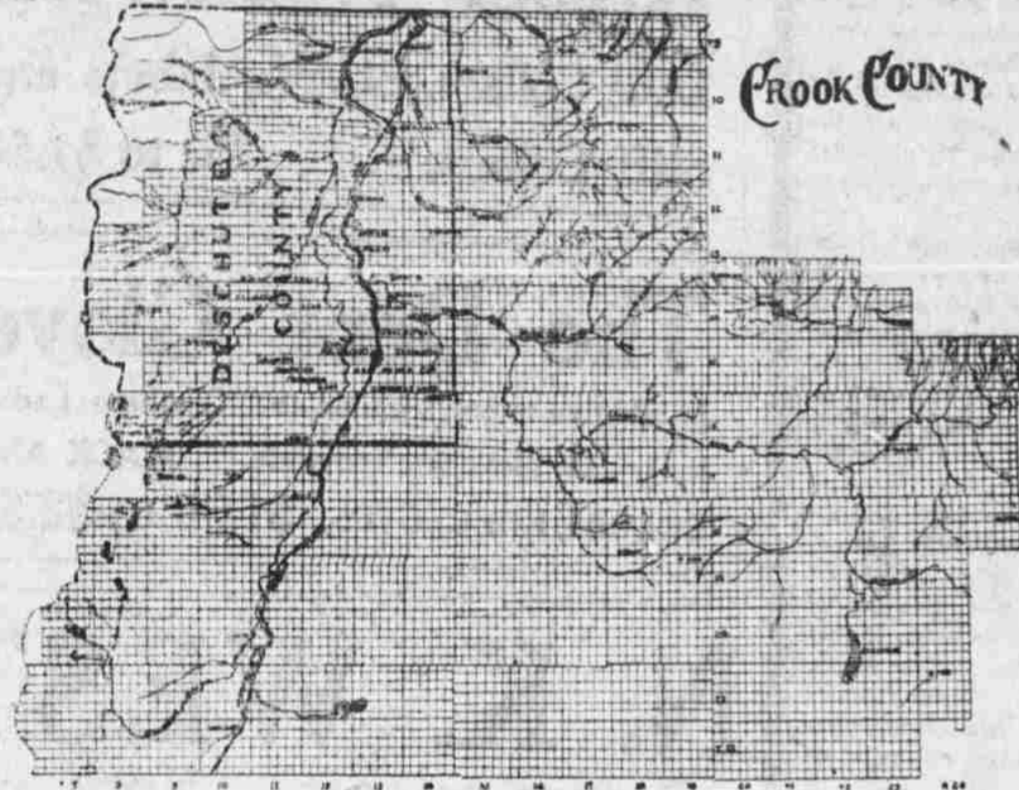

Prineville, Ore., June 28.—(Special.)—Crook County will occupy a unique position at the November election in that it will be the only parent county on record to aid in its own division. Deschutes, the new county it is proposed to create from a portion of Crook, has the hearty co-operation of the parent county. Several meetings have been held at Prineville lately by committees from Redmond and Madras and representative Prineville people in which good feeling predominated.

Prineville has promised to do all in its power to have the new county created. In turn the Madras and Redmond people will resist further division of the county until conditions shall demand it.
