Here's something distinctly new in American music; European prodigies wishing to come across the water to study with an American prima-donna.

For years we have been sending our wonderful talent to Europe and have been pouring a golden stream into the coffers of the European masters—and some, it is to be feared, who are not great masters.

But it is rare indeed that Europe so recognizes American genius that she sends pupils to us.

Ellen Beach Yaw, the famous Southern California nightingale, has been besought to take on promising operatic pupils no less than half a dozen times in the past year. These European youngsters have every prospect of a glorious future, and engagements are awaiting them in opera houses royal and municipal.

Oscar Saenger, of New York, has already done some remarkable work in developing voices for the European stage, and Miss Yaw, after she has finished the great concert career which is just opening for her, will probably do the same thing.

"At present," says Miss Yaw, "it is of course impossible for me to even coach the most distinguished young singers, as my own career is so filled with engagements that I find it impossible to sing for more than one-third of the managers who proffer me dates. Eventually, I shall be glad to help brilliant young voices along, and in the years to come, when I have ceased the 'grand tour', and have made the operatic engagement a matter of history, I shall consider it a duty to find and present great new voices to the world. Ordinance No. 490, Series 1910.

An Ordinance declaring the cost of improving Adams avenue from the east curb line of 4th street to the east curb line of Hemlock street, assessing the property benefited thereby, declaring such assessment and directing the entry of the same in the docket of City liens, authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds to pay for said improvement and declaring an emergency.

The City of La Grande Does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That the Council has considered the proposed assessment for improving Adams avenue from the east curb line of 4th street to the east curb line of Hemlock street, and all objections made thereto, and hereby ascertains, determines and declares the whole cost of said improvement in the manner provided by resolution duly passed by the Council on the 2nd day of February, 1910, to be the sum of \$34,841.21, and the special and peculiar benefits accruing to each lot, or part thereof or parcel of land within the assessment district by reason of said improvement and in just proportion to such benefits, are in the respective amounts, set opposite the number or description of each lot or part thereof or parcel of land in the annexed assessment roll, and said assessment roll, which is numbered 3, is hereby adopted and approved as the assessment for said improvement, and the Recorder of the City of La Grande, is directed to enter a statement of the assessment hereby made in the docket of City liens and cause notice thereof to be published as provided by Charter.

That said sums of money hereby levied as set out in said assessment roll annexed hereto, being assessment roll numbered 3, shall be and become due and payable at the expiration of 60 days from the date this ordinance takes effect; Provided however, that all persons whose property is affected by this assessment, may, upon application to the Recorder of the City of La Grande, be allowed to make payment of the respective amounts assessed against their property as shown by said assessment roll, in ten equal annual installments, under, and by virtue of the Statutes of the State of Oregon, in such cases made and provided, and of the Charter of the City of La Grande, deferred payments to bear interest at 4 per cent per annum. If such application be not made as above set out, then the assessments shall be and become wholly due and payable at the expiration of said sixty days.

Section 2. That there shall be issued and negotiated improvement bonds in the said sum of \$34,841.21, or so much thereof as shall not be covered by cash payments within 60 days, to run for a period of ten years, bearing interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, for the purpose of paying for said improvement.

Section 3. Inasmuch as the improvement herein mentioned is completed, and it is necessary and expedient that payment be made therefor at once, now, therefore, in order to preserve the credit of the City, and its peace, health and safety an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in force and take effect after its approval by the Mayor and its publication for one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer on the 5th day of November, 1910.

Passed the Council on the 2nd day of November, 1910, by five members voting therefor.
