SHIPMENTS CONDEMNED

EIGHT HUNDRED BOXES HELD UP
BY COUNTY INSPECTOR.

Found to be Wormy—Determined to Prevent Poor Shipments.

Eight hundred boxes of apples, packed and ready for shipment at the Oliver warehouse, were condemned by County Fruit Inspector Stillwell late Saturday night. The fruit was found wormy and though not all that way, it was necessary to condemn the entire shipment.

Inspector Stillwell is determined to prevent a shipment of blemished goods from this valley and though the growers will suffer in some instances the general results will be that the reputation of the valley will be so established that when the fruit is branded Grande Ronde it will be known to be wholesome.
