Sporting Notes.

The Indianapolis Commercial Bowling league will award a diamond medal to the high average man at the end of the present season. It is valued at \$75.

Umpire Tommy Connelly of the American league staff will again work in the National Roller Polo league, made of New England town, this winter.

Jim McAleer, the once great outfielder, who has been managing the Senators this season, has signed a two years' contract with them at \$10,000 a year.

Frank Kanaly, the Boston runner, who did so well in England the past summer, recently defeated M. T. Day, regarded as the best man in England, in a mile race by fifteen yards in 4 minutes 27 seconds.

Bouchard recently won the professional foot race around Paris, in which 200 started and which was witnessed by fully 300,000 persons. Orphee, who ran in recent six day races in this country, was second.

Flower and Tree.

Between 4,000 and 5,000 species of orchids are known. Nearly every color occurs. Blue is the rarest. Usually the flowers have a sweet, heavy perfume.

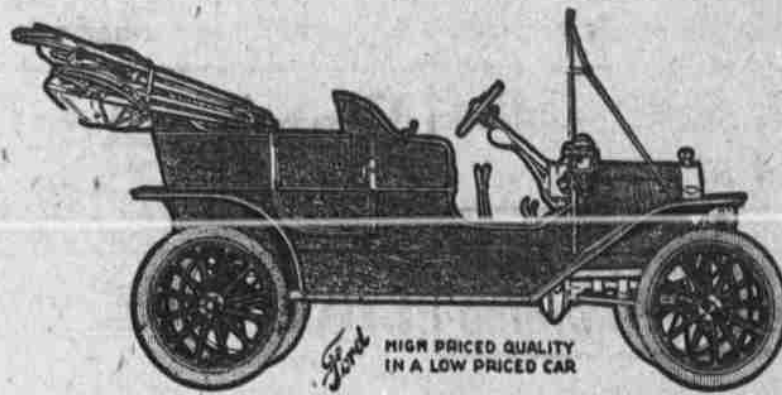
