NEW RULING EFFECTIVE.

U. of O. Infers the Requirements of Athletes in Standings.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Ore., Nov 14 (Special)—To offset a prevailing opinion that athletics are not good students, and to maintain the high standard of scholarship at the University of Oregon, the faculty has adopted a scheme whereby every athlete who is low in his studies must forfeit all right to participate in all contests or practice, until he can bring up his grade to an average mark. So far this year the plan has been a success. Nine football men have been forced to turn in their suits, and in each case by diligent pursuit of his studies, the man has been allowed to return to the game. The rule applies to other student activities besides football. Three glee club men so far have been asked their voices a temporary rest and two of them are again back on the club. The edict reaches all classes of athletes and no matter how valuable a man is to his team or club, he must get his lessons or quit.

As a rule athletes are the best students, and the percentage of football men reported this year is very small in comparison to the percentage of students who are not athletes. Besides it is a very effective measure against "ringers."

Every professor has a complete list of those engaged in athletics or other student enterprises, registered in his department, and he must report any low grade received by these students to the head office.

Baker's Building Ready.

One year, three months and twelve days after the ground was broken, the new Federal building in this city stands completed, and is now the home of Baker's postoffice, the change having been made yesterday and the first mail sent from the new location last night, relates the Baker City Democrat.

The government appropriation for the building was \$65,000 and practically the entire sum has been expended in its completion. The delays attendant upon its construction have been the subject of much publicity, but its all over now and we have a public building at last which is a thing of beauty to the city, and of which our residents may well be proud.

The native building stone used in its construction is a permanent advertisement of a Baker county product and the plumbing work and heating system installed by a local firm, and the lighting system, the work of a Baker City company, speaks highly of our own progressive industrial enterprise.

The first floor is occupied by the postoffice proper, and the private office suite of the postmaster, and on the second floor are the Weather Bureau offices, while in the basement is a lounging room and baths for the use of the carriers. The first mail will be distributed from the new office today.
