WEBSTER COMING HERE. Will Address the State Threshermen's Association Delegates Here. When the State Threshermen's Association meets in La Grande in December, Judge Webster, the premier road booster will be on hand to talk good roads with the threshermen of the state. This convention is an important one, for the threshermen stand for good roads and roads are discussed more fervently and with more consideration than their own particular subjects, no doubt. At any rate the coming of Webster will mean even added interest and action in the matter of better roads. An interesting program will be arranged for this convention which will be in session on the tenth of December. Prominent editors, manufacturers, threshermen from all over the state, and a score of influential men of the Pacific northwest will make La Grande their mecca at that time. DEBATES SEEN UNCERTAIN. Unknown Just What Kind of Arrangement Will be Made for 1910. Last year's triangular debating system has been thrown over board in Oregon and just what will be substituted, is uncertain. Last year La Grande bested all the teams in the entire eastern half of the state save one, and there is considerable local interest in debates, but according to J. S. Landers, the Pendleton principal who last year had charge of affairs, there is much undecided everywhere. In the Pendleton Live Wire, Mr. Landers points out: Pendleton high school will have one, two or three debating teams this year which will contest for the honors of not only Eastern Oregon, but the entire state the number to be decided as soon as the state authorities on such matters decide how the state shall be distributed. According to Superintendent J. S. Landers, the debating conditions in this state are in a very unsatisfactory state at this time with no definite basis determined on at this time as to how the various debating teams will decide their priority. According to the schedule made last year, the various teams of the state were divided into triangles, each school having two debating teams which debated at two different towns each week, one at home and one abroad. A system of points were in vogue which gave all teams an equal show both on strength and decision. This year the triangle system has been done away with and the various schools of the state are at sea both as to how many teams they may debate with and with whom. DREADED MALARY FOUND.
