Notice of the Recorder of the City of La Grande, Oregon, of assessments for the improvement of Depot street from the east curb line of Fourth street to the south curb line of Jefferson avenue.

Notice of Street Improvement.

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 9th day of November, 1910, creating Improvement District No. 27 and designating N. 2nd street as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 2nd day of November 1910, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of N. 2nd street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon macadam pavement, the Council, will ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of North Second street from the O. R. & N. side of the R. R. track to the center of Lake avenue. Notice is hereby further given that the Council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$13,500.00. That the Council will on the 23rd day of November, 1910, meet at the Council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.

GOOD ROADS MEET DECEMBER 12.

State Association Will Send Out an Extensive Invitation List.

Every county commissioner of the state, either entering or retiring from office, every road supervisor, every county judge, every member of the Oregon Legislature in both houses, every member of the State Threshers' association, and every vice president of all the county automobile associations, is to be invited by the Oregon Good Roads' Association to come to Portland, December 12 to attend a great good roads convention which was called at the meeting held last evening, says the Portland Telegram.

This convention is to formulate the bill or bills which the legislature will be asked to enact into law in the greater good roads programme that is opening. Every man who is interested in the work, and who can aid in advancing it will be urged to attend. If the convention cannot agree upon one bill, more than one will be prepared, embodying the best views of all the workers.

Judge L. R. Webster, manager of the good roads work, spoke for an hour on the plans which seem to him most feasible. He wants to see appointed an honorary highway commission, to serve without salary, as does the State Medical board. This commission, the Judge would have empowered with authority to name a highway commissioner for the entire state, who should serve for about \$1,000 a year, and should have charge of all state road work, and act in an advisory capacity for county work. Then the Judge would have a measure of state aid given for much of the county road work, to insure placing the work under the direction of the state commissioner, so as to bring forth uniform results and get best returns from all road expenditures.

At the meeting last evening many suggestions were offered for championship before the coming state convention. Some of the local enthusiasts want to champion one or more through highways, north-south, east-west. Others want efforts now centered upon county improvement first. Some want the matter of road work left entirely to the counties, acting individually and separately. Others want the state to name a commission, which shall select a highway commissioner, which shall select a highway commissioner and to have the state render a certain percentage of state aid to county work, to give it form and symmetry. Out of all the various suggestions, it is intended to draft some measures which will serve all parts of the state best, and to get all interests of the state together, the big convention has been called for December 12.

EVERGREENS IN DEMAND.

Call Comes From Idaho for Blue Mountain Shrubbery for Xmas.

A new use has been found for the young forests in the Blue mountains just east of Pendleton. They are to provide Christmas trees for the youngsters in the home of Twin Falls, Buhl and other southern Idaho towns, and they are also to provide evergreen shade for lawns at city and farm homes, says a Pendleton paper.

S. A. Dickey, a nurseryman of Buhl, Idaho, arrived in Pendleton last evening for the purpose of securing a large shipment of young fir and hemlock trees. The young trees will be transferred to the Idaho towns by the car loads.

Mr. Dickey first aims to supply the Christmas trade and after that is done he will stock his nursery with the young evergreen trees so that they can be supplied to the city residents and farmers as they are wanted. He thinks it will require several carloads to supply Christmas trees.

The Farmer Folk of Portugal.

The peasant and small farmer has had practically no active part in the present revolution which was carried through by one wing of the army and the Republicans of Lisbon. He is not interested in politics, and would not care to be bothered with political discussion. He is always ready to "let well enough alone," and does not see why his compatriots in the city do not feel the same way. The country people are contented. Most of them own their small farms, in fact, in northern Portugal it is rare that a laborer does not own a plot of soil on which to grow his vegetables and also a few of the bright colored flowers which so delight his eye.—The Christian Herald.
