PENDLETON TALKS COMMISSION.

New Form of Government is Fostered in the Old Wheat Town.

Pendleton, November 22—The East Oregonian says:

That Pendleton should adopt the commission plan of government is the firm belief of T. G. Montgomery, cashier of the American National bank and a member of the present city council. In speaking of the subject today Mr. Montgomery said:

"Upon my recent trip through the south and middle states I heard much about the commission plan and I believe it is the right thing. I have not investigated the subject particularly close but I would like to have local people look into the matter to ascertain it would not be well for Pendleton to adopt the commission plan."

"Right now we have much heavy business to attend to and there is much improvement work to be done. Who is going to get out without salary and devote his time and attention to these things. We do all we can for the city but unpaid councilmen never work hard enough. If we had a commission composed of three men and these men were paid salaries of say \$1,000 to \$1,500 a year, they could handle affairs in a business like manner. They would not need to give up all their time to the work, but they should give to their duties all the time and attention that is necessary."

YANKEE RACE DYING OUT.

High Cost of Living One Cause, Says Harvard Professor.

The Yankee race, which is the pure English stock, is almost extinct, according to the views of Professor Albert Bushnell Hart of the department of history and government at Harvard university. Moreover, he has statistics to prove that his contention contains some truth.

Among the conditions to which Professor Hart attributes the decadence of the red blooded American are the increased cost of living, late marriages, expensive educations and other social conditions of a contributory nature. The figures on which he bases his positive assertion come from the United States census and a perusal of the class histories of Harvard.

"There have been great changes in the ages of marriage and the per capita number of children since colonial times," says Professor Hart. "Some of the changes are of a startling nature. Men of Yankee blood, if we may take the successive classes of

Harvard as fair examples, have less than one-fifth as many children as when this country was first settled."

Professor Hart found that in the class of 1871 there were eleven graduates, of whom but one remained a bachelor. The ten husbands had seventy-one children. For the decadent side of the question the investigator announces that in the class of 1880 170 men received degrees, and at the present time there are not an equal number of sons, proving to Professor Hart's satisfaction that Harvard university would soon die out if it depended upon the sons of its graduates for undergraduate material.
