POWLS DIG UP GOLD.

Finding of Nuggets Near Spokane Will Lead to Further Investigation.

Spokane, Wash., Nov. 25 (Special)—Nuggets were unearthed and gold was found in the fowls that scratched in the dirt, Nov. 19, at the Gus McFeron ranch near Hayford, 10 miles west of Spokane on the Medical lake and Cheney Electric line of the Washington Water Power company, where excavations were being made for a building.

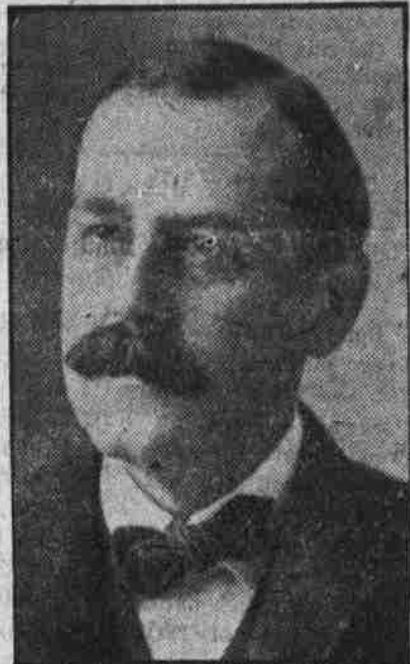
Mr. McFeron stated the facts to R. Lewis Rutter, secretary of the Spokane & Eastern Trust company, who said, in giving the information that there was no question as to the authenticity of the reports and that the finds would justify an immediate investigation. McFeron expects to personally take charge of the work of mining his ranch, the work to begin at once.

The evidence is such as to lead to the conclusion that other nuggets are to be found in that vicinity. An excavation was being made for a building on the farm when the first discovery was made and the matter created much excitement among the workmen. When a chicken was killed it was examined, and it had been noticed that the chickens had been around where the fresh earth was being thrown, and other small pieces of gold were found.

The opinion has already been volunteered that the nuggets have come from the hills in the direction of Cheney, Wash.

For the reason that separate nuggets were located in the diggings at the McFeron ranch, it is thought that the find will prove to be an important one.

McFeron has been a resident of Spoken county for 20 years and is a wealthy and prominent rancher.

Wallowa's Assessments.

While the board of equalization has not completed all the work before it, and Assessor Moore therefore is not able to give the exact footings of the 1910 assessment, he risks an estimate of close to \$9,000,000 exclusive of the railroads, express, telegraph and telephone company properties. These items as assessed by Mr. Miller in 1909 totaled \$955,020 so if the state tax board that now fixes the assessment on such corporations, does as well as Mr. Miller did last year the total assessed valuation of property in Wallowa county for 1910 will be right at the ten million mark.

The valuation last year was \$8,676,770 or less the railroads, telephone and telegraph lines, \$7,721,750, so the increase over last year is close to one and three-quarter million dollars—News Record.
