LOCAL FARMERS HONORED

McALLISTER AND NORRIS HOLD
POSITIONS WITH UNION.

State Meeting at The Dalles Results
in Important Transactions.

A special from The Dalles, Ore., of Nov. 23 says: Resolutions recommending the enactment of a law by the state legislature requiring warehouses to ship grain in the order that orders for shipping are given them, as a fair deal to all growers, was adopted today by the State Farmers' Educational and Co-operative Union, which has been in session here since yesterday.

Upon the recommendation of the legislation committee, the union also decided to send committees to sessions of the state legislature whenever matters of importance to agriculturists were under consideration.

Inspection Law Urged.

The enactment of a grain inspection law was urged and this will be one of the important matters in which the legislative committee will interest themselves. In general, the resolutions adopted by the present convention are those adopted by the North Carolina Farmers' Union, at its session in September.

The state board of the union has decided to hold its next meeting at Pendleton on the second Friday in January, at which time a campaign to increase the membership of the union and to promote its interests will be started in the jurisdiction which includes Oregon and all of the state of Idaho south of Idaho county.

The election of officers to serve the union during the ensuing year was held this afternoon and resulted as follows: President, John W. McAllister of La Grande; vice president, Price Robinson of Coquille; secretary, F. A. Sikes of Milton; chaplain, E. Richards of The Dalles; doorkeeper, Fred Krushow, of Grass Valley; conductor F. S. Biddow of Holdman.

The new executive board is composed of E. S. Norris of La Grande; Clyde Williams of Buhl, Idaho; W. M. Waterman of The Dalles; J. D. Brown of Arlington; C. C. Connor of Helix.

OREGON SHORT LINE TAKES OVER ROADS.

Branch Lines in Southern Idaho Deeded; Many Extensions to be Made.

Vale, Ore., Nov. 24—A deed of importance filed in the Malheur county clerk's office in this city is that in which the Minidoka & Southwestern lines in Idaho transfer all of their lines as well as extensions and new projects to the Oregon Short Line. The deed is dated October 31, 1910 and shows that the lines had up to that time been leased and operated by the Oregon Short Line.

The lines purchased are: A line of railroad extending from a point of connection with the Oregon & Navigation railroad at Minidoka, west of Burley, thence in a westerly direction along the Snake river to Buhl for a distance of 74.281 miles, with a projected extension of said line northwesterly to the towns of Bruneau and Cuffey to the Idaho-Oregon state line and westerly and northerly through to Malheur county, Oregon, to a point of connection with the Oregon Short Line railroad at Nyssa, Ore., a distance of 155.066 miles; also a branch line of the Twin Falls line extending from Twin Falls in a southerly direction to Rogerson, for a distance of 29.02 miles with a projected extension in a southerly direction through Twin Falls county to the Nevada-Idaho state line intersecting the state line near mile post 31, thence in a southerly and southeasterly direction through Elko county, Nevada, to a point of connection with the Central Pacific at Valley Pass station for a distance of 90.830 miles.

Also a branch line of railroad partly constructed and known as the Oakley branch extending from Burley on the Oregon Short Line in a southerly and southern direction to the Oakley townsite, Idaho, for a distance of 21.748 miles; also a branch line partly constructed and known as the North Side branch, extending from Rupert on the Oregon Short Line in a western and a northwesterly direction through Jerome and Wendell to a point of connection with the Ore-

gon Short Line at or near, Bliss, Idaho, a distance of 72 miles.
