BIG TRACT NOW IMPROVED

WORKMEN COMMENCE SETTING OUT BIG ORCHARD.

Aim is Not Complete Work Now but End it Next Spring.

Another huge orchard commenced to assume tangible form yesterday afternoon when the La Grande Investment company set a large crew of men to work planting the tract near Imbler known as the Penington farm. There are score after score of acres in the tract and it will all be planted by Spring. It is not the aim of promoters to set all the trees out at this time, but the start has been made nevertheless and will be completed next spring so that the sale of the small tracts to which the farm has been cut up, can go on.

This tract will add materially to the acreage of orchard land in the Imbler district, where orchards by the hundred of acres have been cut out in the past two or three years.
