WOOD BUSINESS NEW FORM GOES PROFITABLE INTO EFFECT

KAMELA HAS SHIPPED OUT 125 CABS THIS YEAR.

Dealers Receive About Twenty Thousand for Year's Work.

Kamela, Dec. 7 (Special).—Twenty thousand dollars worth of wood has been shipped from Kamela during the past year, according to a close estimate made here this week. F. Truax has shipped 125 carloads and about as many more have been shipped out by other parties. The average carload is eighteen cords, or a total of 4500 cords in all. The average price received brings the total receipts from this little town to \$20,000.

BAKER CITY NOW CONDUCTED BY THE COMMISSION PLAN

New Officers Take Oath Tuesday at 10 O'Clock.

Baker City, Dec. 7.—The Herald said last night:

The commission plan of city government was inaugurated in Baker today when Chas. L. Palmer, Geo. W. Henry and Anderson Finley took their oaths of office. They were sworn in this morning at 10 o'clock the old council met in final session and turned over the affairs of the city to their successors.

Mayor Palmer thanked the voters for the confidence reposed in the new administration and said that he hoped the people would still have as much faith in them at the conclusion of their term of office. He said they would administer the affairs of the city in as economical a manner as possible considering the growth and progressiveness of the city.

Great interest centered in the appointments, which were made as follows:

By the Mayor Commissioner: Wm. Riley, chief of police; Henry Bowman and D. H. B. Rhoades, policemen; A. B. "Ott" Sterna, city clerk; John Adams, deputy; J. W. Bailey, city engineer; Gustav Anderson, city attorney.

By Commissioner Finley: Luther Mahan, street foreman; H. E. Hanna, stable man and utility man.

By Commissioner Henry: Percy W. Drack, water collector; F. H. Grabner, fire chief; W. R. Shook, C. Miller, and Cliff Bales, paid firemen; Dr. J. W. Huff, city health officer; Frank Gooding, foreman of water works; Alfred Winder, superintendent of water department.

The three commissioners then proceeded with the routine business and the commission plan of government in Baker will be in full swing.

COLUMBUS DAY.

Thirteen States Now Honor the Discoverer of America.
Those who enjoy a rest on Oct. 12 can thank the Knights of Columbus. For it was through their untiring efforts that that date has now been made a legal holiday in thirteen states of the

Union to commemorate the discovery of America by Christopher Columbus.

It was Colorado that took the lead in the matter. On April 1, 1907, both branches of its legislature passed a

resolution "setting aside the twelfth day of October each year as a public holiday, to be known as Columbus day."

The governor, who was heartily in favor of the measure, signed it immediately and the bill became a law. Other states that have made Columbus day a legal holiday are California, Connecticut, Illinois, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, Montana, New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania.

It will doubtless surprise many to know that there are no less than twenty-nine statues and monuments to Columbus in America. There are six in Spain and seven in Italy. What is believed to be the first Columbus shaft erected in the United States is that in Baltimore. It is a hundred years old. There is a fine bust of Columbus in the White House at Washington.
