Ordinance No. 592, Series 1910. An Ordinance amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 413, Series 1909. The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 413, Series 1909, be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 1. The City Attorney shall attend to all actions, suits and proceedings in which the City is legally interested, and prosecute all persons charged with the violation of City Ordinances; he shall prepare all contracts, bonds, leases, ordinances, resolutions or other instruments in writing, in relation to the business of the City, and shall give his advice and counsel, and furnish a written opinion concerning any matter in which the City is interested, when asked so to do by the Mayor, or Council or any committee of the Council. He shall receive as his compensation for his said services a salary of \$75 per month payable monthly out of the general fund of the city.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, and after its approval by the Mayor shall be in force and take effect from and after the 10th day of March, 1911.

Passed the Council on the 14th day of December, 1910, by 6 members voting therefor. Approved this 15th day of December, 1910.

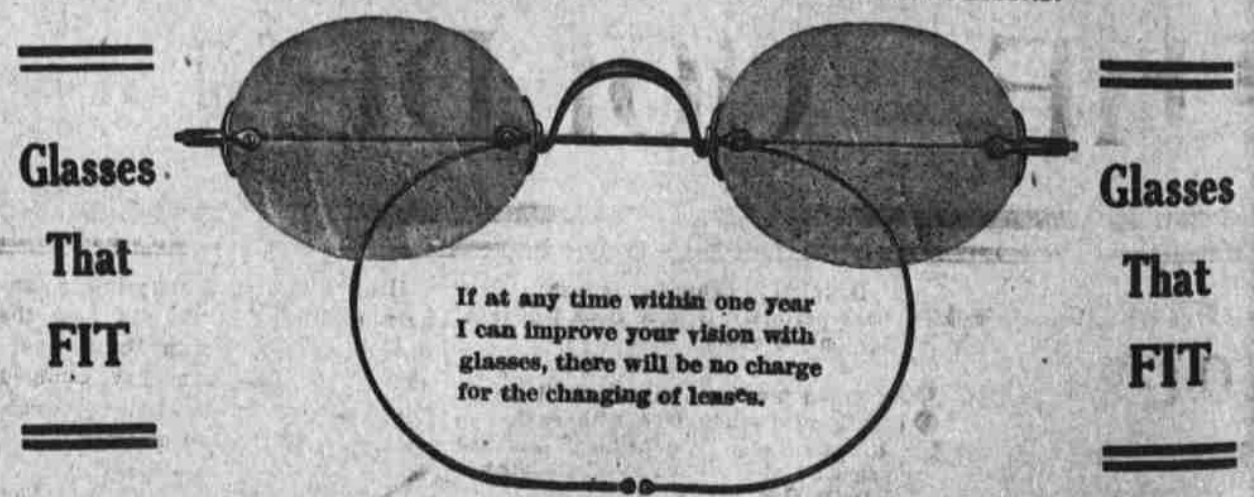
