Sherwood closed a deal with an independent film house to supply a run of pictures for the local house and if the pictures continue as satisfactory as the first consignment has proven itself to be, it is evident that the trust will be bucked by the Isis at the time hereafter.

The trust includes an enormous number of film makers, but there are others in the business as is attested to by the pictures which go on tonight for the first time under the new order of things at the Isis. The actors in the independent are better, themes elevated and all important phases are fully up to the standard. One of the films is slightly scratched; in this is the only weakness in the entire program. This will not occur again, however and there is every reason to believe that the independent makes will prove fully as entertaining as the trust-made pictures.
