MOSCOW CATHEDRAL.

Fantastic Looking Edifice Erected by *Jesus the Terrible*.

One of the most extraordinary and fantastic Christian places of worship in the world is the Cathedral of Moscow, known as "Tsar's Blasphemous" structure not only in outline and conception, but even stranger to the observer. You know the architect's name, but the story goes that the czar ordered his eyes to be put out directly the church was completed so that he should never be able to surpass his work. The plan of the building was inspired by the worthless and foolish monarch who ever set on a theme—thus the "Terrible" name of Moscow.

The architecture is in every respect extravagant and bizarre, and the coloring is weird to the extreme. It has nine chapels, roofed by nine cupolas, each different and each stranger than the other. One resembles a pagoda, another a mosque, a third is said to copy a pagoda in its appearance, and the rest are more or less grotesque. Some are gilt, others are painted in brilliant colors. Indeed, the only description is that it is a nightmare of a church, the fitting legacy of a ruler who grinded his enemies in trying pains and forced his subjects to sacrifice in order that trained dogs might vomit and use them to pieces.—Sunday Magazine.

A King's Hobby.

The late King of Spain had an extraordinary hobby—that of collecting empty matchbooks of all nations. In this connection an interesting story is related. During one of his visits to England the king while passing down Bond street one afternoon, accompanied by two members of his staff, espied an empty matchbook which had been discarded by its owner and thrown away into the middle of the thoroughfare. Without a moment's thought the monarch dashed into the middle of the crowded traffic, grasped the much coveted treasure and was nearly run over by a passing cab.
