burnt cork used by minstrels and

cosmette or plgment employed by the profession.
One bouse makes it in the following manner: The corks are placed in three tn vessels, resembling wash bolijers,
with holes punched in their sliees and rottom. Aleobol is sprinkled over the
bund corks, and they they are "ired." When

are kneaded in barrels of water. Thts peration forces the powdered charcoal
