

The Board shall have general supervision over all onvicts taken by any county, and whenever in its opinion they are not properly guarded or cared for, may revoke the order by which they were obtained, and require that they be returned to the penitentiary. Any county may at any time return any or all the convicts obtained

by it to the penitentiary. Each county shall pay all the expenses incident to taking and keeping and returning all convicts taken by it, from the time they are taken until they are either discharged or are returned to the penitentiary. The right of the several counties to secure the labor of convicts, as herein provided, shall be paramount to all other methods of work as in this Act provided. Section 2.

All convicts, save only such as an excepted by Section one (1) of this Act, not in service in some county, as provided in Section two of this Act. shall be worked on the public roads of this state, or in the preparation of the causes of the rear end wreck at road-making material, under the direct management and control of the Highway Commissioner. If a sufficient number of convicts are available. the Board shall establish at least three central camps or stations for the crushing of rock, suitable for the construction of macadamized roads. one in Southern Oregon, one in the Willamette valley, and one in Eastern Oregon, and such board may establish as many similar camps or stations in such parts of the state as


