FAVORS A GOOD FEAR BILL WILL BE PASSED

LOCAL PEOPLE ALMOST READY TO GO TO SALEM.

Believe in Good Roads But Oppose the Webster Bill.

General fear is expressed today among local people that the Webster good roads bill will be passed at this session of the legislature, and should this occur it will be looked upon as one of the state calamities which sometimes follow the work of a legislature such as the one now in session at Salem.

"I feel like going to Salem and having my say before the committee," said a land owner this morning to the Evening Observer. "This is a matter that should call forth the objection of every man interested in land and property. The idea of taxing the people of Oregon to build a sight-seeing automobile highway for tourist travel is out of the question especially when on all sides we need better roads for hauling grain and other commodities. No sir, I am not in favor of passing a law to give Judge Webster or any other man a job as highway commissioner, and if the law does pass I want to say to you that it will cause trouble. People who produce will stand a good deal, but they will not stand such high handed robbery as this bill promises to enforce."

Then he suffered a relapse and his death followed.

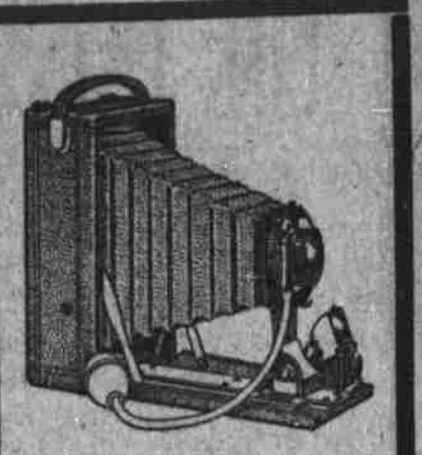
