From Six to Twelve inches of Sleet and Snow Have Fallen.

Chicago, Feb. 6.—One of the worst storms this winter with snow and sleet is sweeping the Rockies to Buffalo and blocking the railroads in the north and middle west and causing a great property loss. From six to twelve inches of snow and sleet have fallen over Nebraska, Iowa and northern Illinois. Howling winds are piling the drifts. Suburban lines in Chicago are blocked.

This announcement was made yesterday when Mr. Ellis tendered his resignation to the regular board meeting of the officials and came much as a surprise for the congregation knew nothing of his contemplated actions until the announcement was made. Mr. and Mrs. Ellis will move to their ranch and devote their time to the growing of fruit. Mr. Ellis has unbounded faith in the future of this valley and is planning to create

him a summer home where a few months of each year will be spent in raising fruit. In the fall he will continue his ministerial labors in some needy field.

Two years ago Rev. Ellis entered the local Christian church field, fresh from college and in these two years he has been instrumental in building up the institution with over 100 new memberships. A spirit of unity has existed among the members and much disappointment was shown on hearing of their pastor's action. Young, energetic, ambitious and devout in his work the young reverend has won many friends outside of his own fold and the fact that he is to leave active work in the local church field is regretted by his many friends.
