To Whom It May Concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 9th day of February, 1910, creating improvement District No. 17, and designating Jef-

erson Avenue as such district and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said Common Council on the 18th day of January, 1911, whereby said Council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Jefferson Avenue, in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon Bitulithic pavement, the Council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Jefferson Avenue, from the north side of Chestnut street to the north side of Cove Avenue.

(A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

All that part of blocks 110, 111, 113, and 114 of Chaplin's Add. to La Grande Oregon, lying northeast of the alley between Adams and Jefferson Avenues, of said streets. These elongated streaks of humanity are a scream of laughter from start to finish in their monologue work. While their singing is rather weak it is overcome by its cleverness and their clever dancing.

These two vaudeville acts are a fitting close to the vaudeville in this city for the time being and all lovers of the unusual should see and hear Miss Still in her clever and mysterious flying aeroplane act. The house was filled to overflowing last night and it is expected that a full house will greet this lady during her stay here.
