HORSES DASHED DOWN HILL

HAULING LOAD OF WOOD, TEAM

Without any Injuries.

Dashing down the steep mountain road south of the city at breakneck speed dragging a heavy load of wood behind them, a team of horses driven by Roy Clapp and Jake Baker of South La Grande yesterday cut capers with self destruction but escaped unharmed.
