AUCTION HOE COLLECTION

Artistics Gathered by Press Maker Will be Sold Out.

New York, Feb. 15—Art collectors and dealers from all parts of the United States and from Canada and Europe as well as in town to bid for the many choice items contained in the Hoe collection, which is to be sold at auction under the direction of the American Art Association. The sale began today and will be continued daily until March 3. Over 5,000 items in all are to go under the hammer.

The collection embraces all the artistic property brought together by the late Robert Hoe, the millionaire head of R. Hoe and company, printing press manufacturers of New York and London, who died in London on Sept. 22, 1909. The sale will probably bring several million dollars in receipts, and beyond question will be the most important dispersal of artistic property ever conducted in the United States.

Embraced in the collection are a number of famous paintings and many etchings, engravings, drawings, old Chinese porcelains, rare European ceramics, silver goldsmith's work, Limoges enamels, old ivories, old miniatures, snuff boxes, watches, bronzes, ancient arms and armor, tapestries, rugs, embroideries, clocks, furniture and numerous other objects of artistic interest.

COLT A HEAVYWEIGHT

Young Percheron Loaned O. A. C. for Class Work Weighs 1,085 Lbs.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Feb. 15 (Special)—A 10 months old Percheron colt loaned to the Oregon Agricultural college department of animal husbandry for use in the stock judging classes, one of several sent by J. B. Stump of Monmouth, weighs 1,085 pounds, and is not only of phenomenal size, but of excellent conformation as well. The average draft colt throughout the country would be at least 300 pounds lighter, and not as well made while the average cayuse does not weigh 1,085 when fully matured.

Still Paying Dividends.

Chicago, Ill., Feb. 15—Stockholders of the Pullman Palace Car Company today received the usual quarterly dividend of \$2 a share on their holdings. Though it is said that the forced reduction in Pullman berths just put into effect will lessen the company's earnings by several million dollars a year it is not expected that the annual \$8 dividend rate will be affected. The company anticipates that the increased business will eventually more than make up for the reduction in price.

Suffragists Provide Sinews of War.

New York, Feb. 15—The National Woman's Suffrage Association, whose headquarters are in this city, today formally launched a campaign to raise a fund of \$150,000 to carry on the fight for women's ballot rights. The day for beginning the movement was appropriately chosen, this being the anniversary of the birth of Susan B. Anthony, one of the first and probably the most famous advocates of equal rights in America.

Western Fruit Jobbers.

Sacramento, Cal., Feb. 15—The Western Fruit Jobbers' Association, composed of the dealers and sales agents who place the products of the California orchards and vineyards on the Eastern market, met in Sacramento today for their annual convention. It is the first time the association has met west of Denver. The discussion of questions of common interest will occupy the members until Saturday, after which they will be taken on a trip through the California fruit country.

Hearing on Commutation Rates.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 15—The troublesome question of commutation rates between New York city and suburban points in New Jersey and elsewhere, which has been a cause for contention between the railroads and the commuters for a long time, came up for hearing on appeal today before the Interstate Commerce Commission. The original decision in the case was unfavorable to the railroads.
