POTATO CHECK REPRODUCED

Frank G. Scott sends Facsimile of D. E. Burley Check to M. Snyder.

An effective manner of advertising certain products has been hit upon by the Twin Falls commercial club and Frank G. Scott a former resident of this city, sends the Observer a sample of the unique creation.

The object of the plan is to give "Back Home" advertising to the fact that Twin Falls produces potatoes, and that in profitable quantities. Some time ago Louis A. Snyder a farmer living near Twin Falls raised 645 bushels on a single acre and won the D. E. Burley prize of \$500. A facsimile of prize check, made payable in burlesque, to the editor publishing the article attached, is appended, and the members of the Twin Falls commercial club are sending on this facsimile check to their back home papers and in return supply the commercial club with this clipping. Negro to Die in Electric Chair.

Raleigh, N. C., Feb. 14.—The authorities at the state penitentiary here have completed all arrangements for the electrocution of Nathan Montague, the negro recently convicted in Granville county of the murder of Layton Sanders, his daughter and grand daughter. The triple murder was committed on the night of Dec. 18 last. To hide the evidences of his crime the murderer set fire to the Sanders home and the bodies of the victims were burned to a crisp. The blood stained skirt and purse of one of the victims was found in the possession of Montague. Immediately after his arrest he was hurried to the state prison here to escape vengeance at the hands of citizens. Three weeks ago he was returned to Oxford for trial and was convicted by the jury after eight minutes' deliberation. Tomorrow is the day fixed for his electrocution.

Youngest Colonel in Army.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 14.—Among the several changes and promotions among army officers resulting from the retirement today of Brig. Gen. George B. Davis, one of the most interesting is the promotion of Lieut. Col. John A. Hull, to the rank of colonel. Colonel Hull, who is not yet 37 years old, is by about 15 years the youngest officer of his rank in the entire military establishment of the United States. He is the son of former Congressman J. A. Hull of Iowa, and has been in the army about 13 years. As judge advocate general of the Department of the East he has directed the preparation and prosecution of the very court-martial that has been held in that department in the past four years. His promotion does not affect his former place, and he will continue on duty indefinitely on Governor's Island.

Texas Hardware Dealers.

Houston, Texas, Feb. 14.—Prominent retail hardware dealers from every section of Texas were on hand today at the opening of the annual convention of their state association. Mayor Rice extended a cordial greeting to the visitors and President Chas. B. Smith delivered his annual address. No session was held this afternoon, the time being devoted to an inspection of the large exhibition of hardware goods that is being held in connection with the gathering. The regular session will be held tomorrow and will conclude Thursday.

Albert Lea, Minn., Feb. 15.—Preparations for the thirty-seventh annual convention of the Young Men's Christian Associations of Minnesota were completed today. The sessions will begin here tomorrow and will continue until the end of the week. Many prominent association workers will take part.

Chicago, Ill., Feb. 14.—The annual spring session of the American Baseball League opened in Chicago today with an attendance of numerous managers and players as well as club owners. The large attendance indicated that some importance business outside the usual routine is likely to be transacted before the seasons close, which probably will be Thursday. After the schedules have been adopted the clubs will start on their annual training trips preparatory to the beginning of the real baseball season. Outside of business pertaining to schedules, there is considerable interest in the secret scoring plan to be proposed by President Johnson, also in the ownership of the St. Louis club, the problem of suspended players and the demand of the Eastern and American association for higher classification, all of which will probably come up at the meeting for discussion.
