**REACHES BAKER AND WILL COME ON TO LA GRANDE**

Starts from Ft. Scott on Walk Around the World—Has Grief.

Continuing his walk around the world as correspondent for the Ft. Scott Republican, a man named J. M. White is headed toward La Grande on his way to Seattle where he takes steamer.

He was started out by the Ft. Scott Republican as correspondent and expects to make the trip afoot, earning his way as he progresses. He spoke at the Methodist church at Baker Sunday, and is trying to earn funds to push on for he declares it is not to ask for funds except in exchange for some service. He is now headed for Portland and from there will go to Seattle before sailing.

Telling of his experiences thus far, Mr. White said in Baker yesterday:

"My hardships began in Wyoming in the Sweetwater basin, my postcards and money giving out and between Bryan and Granger I broke through the ice three times in one night, and made 38 miles that day after all. At Granger I paid \$1.25 for supper and \$1.00 for breakfast in trade as my cash was all gone. A new editor took charge of the Republican at Ft. Scott and has not been as prompt in handling that end of the enterprise as those who started me out. I got lost on a sheep range in Wyoming and nearly froze to death near Chuck Buttes, but was rescued by sheep herders.

"Through Utah I fared well and my trip through the rugged, sublime scenery of Echo and Weber canyons revealed scenery superior to the grand scenes of Colorado. In Idaho I had a severe battle with water, snow, mud and inclement weather generally, and the trip from American Falls to Shoshone over the desert trail, thirty settled was the severest of my trip."
