New York, March 1 .- Today, Asn Wednesday, marks the beginning or Lent, when social galties give place to a season of fasting and prayer for forty days. Lent had its prefiguring in the forty days of temptation of Christ in the wilderness, as well as in the fasts of Moses and Elias. It is a season of great antiquity.

Ash Wednesday is so called because gins with the solemn ceremony that has given the day its name. After a supplicatory sirvice, the devout approach the altar rall and the priest citing in Latin, "Remember, man, that thou art dust, and shalt return to dust." The ashes are customarily obtained by burning the palms of the previous year.

The Lenten season is strictly observed in the Episcopal and other ritualistic churches as well as in the Roman Catholic church. Special services ar: designated for Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, Good Friday, Palm Sunday, and ending with the grand triumphant service on Easter Sunday. Lent is also the season of the confirmation classes, when those wno soon propose to take their forman stand as church members attend class-Oregon-Washington es of instruction and prepare for the visitation of the bishop. It is also a season of giving, especially in the Sunday schools.
