GET RICH QUICK
PLAN FAILS

MEN WHO SHIPPED SUIT CASE FROM HERE GUILTY.

Said to Have Sent it by Express and Then Stole it Later.

Alleged get-rich-quick schemes are being ferreted out by a Pendleton jury regarding the actions of a man named N. Najjar who on December 5th, shipped from the La Grande express office a suit case which he valued at \$1300, and then, it is said, stole the suit case at Athens, cleverly substituting another suit case badly slashed and cut to pieces. The case went to a Pendleton jury late last night after a trial lasting two days. Local Express Agent George M. Hibberd and "Jumbo" the freight-baggage employe at the local baggage employe at the local baggage office were the principal witnesses to attend the trial from this city.

Najjar shipped a suit case by express from this city on December 5, and it is said that he shipped another suitcase into his trunk which had been checked out from the local baggage office to Athens. The charges go on to state that when the trunk reached Athens he substituted cases, slashing the empty one and leaving it where it might appear that it had been stolen by someone else, and then he himself made away with the valuable case. He was arrested by the express company and his trial occurred at Pendleton and it is unofficially reported today that the jury returned a verdict for the company.

According to the accusations the fellow planned a scheme to collect \$1300 from the company, even after he had acquired possession of the suit cases.

Ordinance No. 514, Series 1911.

An ordinance authorizing the issuance on behalf of the City of La Grande, Oregon, of addition sewer bonds for the purpose of completing the sewer system now being constructed by said city.

The City of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of completing the construction of the present system of sewers in the City of La Grande, Oregon, and pursuant to authority conferred by the Charter of said City, and by a majority vote of the qualified electors of said City, at an election duly called and regularly held, in said City, upon the 12th day of December, 1910, there are hereby authorized to be issued the bonds of the City of La Grande, Oregon to the amount of Ten Thousand dollars (\$10,000), which said bonds shall be dated January 1st, 1911, and shall be in the denomination of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars each and shall be known as Additional Sewer Bonds, and shall be numbered from one (1) to ten (10) both inclusive. Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder of said City; shall be due twenty (20) years from the date thereof, and redeemable at any time after ten (10) years; shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually, as evidenced by coupons thereto attached; and both principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable at the office of the City Treasurer, La Grande, Oregon, or at the banking house of E. H. Rollins & Sons, in the City of Boston, Mass., at the option of the holder.

Section 2. The bonds hereby authorized shall be substantially in the following form:

ADDITIONAL SEWER BOND

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the City of La Grande in the County of Union and the State of Oregon, acknowledges to owe and for value received hereby promises to pay the bearer the sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS lawful money of the United States of America on the first day of January, A. D., 1931, together with interest on said sum from the date hereof until paid at the rate of five (5 per cent) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July in each year upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons hereto attached as they severally become

due. Both principal and interest of this bond are hereby made payable at the office of the City Treasurer, La Grande Oregon, or at the banking house of E. H. Rollins & Sons in the City of Boston, Massachusetts, at the option of the holder; and for the prompt payment of this bond, both principal and interest, the full faith and credit of said City of La Grande are hereby irrevocably pledged. This bond is redeemable at the option of the City of La Grande at any time after January 1, 1921.

This bond is one of a series of like tenor and is issued for the purpose of completing the sewer system now under construction by said City, pursuant to, and in full compliance with, the charter of said city and under, and in accordance with an ordinance of said city duly passed, and authorized by a majority of the qualified voters at an election duly called and regularly held for that purpose in the City of La Grande, on the 12th day of December, 1910.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to, and in the issuing of this bond necessary to make the same legal and valid have been properly done, happened and been performed in regular and due form and time as required by law; and that the total indebtedness of said City of La Grande, including this bond, does not exceed the statutory or constitutional limitations.

In testimony whereof, the City Council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, has caused this bond to be sealed with the corporate seal, signed by its Mayor and countersigned by its Recorder, and caused the annexed interest coupons to be executed by the fac-simile signatures of said officers this first day of January, 1911.

H. Rollins & Sons in the City of Boston, Massachusetts, at the option of the holder, for semi-annual interest due that day on its Additional Sewer Bond, dated January 1, 1911, No.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be

in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor and its publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed the Council this 24th day of February, 1911, by 6 members voting therefor.
