## BUCKLEY READY REALTY FIRM IS TO REPORT LAUNCHED

### LOVETT'S COMING CAUSES REPORT ON DOUBLE TRACK.

#### Buckley Takes Journey Over Entire System to Complete Report.

Regarding the coming of Judge Lovett to Oregon and the recent trip over the O-W by Acting General Manager M. J. Buckley, the East Oregonian advances the following:

Acting General Manager M. J. Buckley and a number of operating officials of the O-W R. N. are on a tour of inspection of the system for the purpose of preparing a report to President R. S. Lovett and Vice President Kruttschnitt when they shall arrive in Portland, probably the latter part of the week. It is understood that the principal report submitted to the head of the Harriman system will have to do with the double-tracking of the main line from Portland to Huntington, which betterment already has been approved and is a part of the \$75,000,000 Union Pacific Southern Pacific budget recently announced.

While there is some belief that the recent rate decision by the interstate commerce commission might have the effect of curtailing expenses and blocking all proposed extensions and improvements, it is not anticipated that the decision will have any serious effect on projects already voted on and approved.

The double-tracking which is likely to be ordered has had a conference with local Harriman officials will involve an expenditure of over \$5,000,000 during the year 1911, and something like that sum for each of the next five years during which the Harriman system expects to spend the \$75,000,000.

The local officials on their present tour have covered practically all of the principal lines involved in the recent O-W. R. & N., the Oregon & Washington and the North Coast or "Strahorn" road on which it is proposed to spend about \$8,000,000 in the next two years in cutting the distance between Portland and Spokane 54 miles. This is another project which will probably be taken up early this spring.

Acting Manager Buckley hopes to be able to persuade President Lovett and Director Kruttschnitt to take a trip up over the Deschutes railroad, which is now completed to Crooked river, in case these officials have the time to give for such a side-trip during their stay in this territory.

While no definite information has been received at Harriman headquarters as to the time of the arrival of the Lovett special from California it is anticipated that the party will reach Portland by the end of the week.

Vice President and General Manager J. P. O'Brien who has been on a leave of absence for the past month may return to Portland with the party, although the latest word received from him was that he would not reach Portland before March 7 or 8.

thinking persons as well. Let the very conditions that produced these miscarriages of justice were the instruments that worked toward permanent good.

The prosecution of the rich law breakers, while they failed in their immediate purpose—to send the rich and powerful criminals to the penitentiary—were wholly successful in their ultimate purpose—to expose the causes behind the corruption of public officers, the solicitude of courts for criminal corporations, to demonstrate to the people the necessity of controlling their own government.

Ruef now says that he would not have been convicted of bribery had Mr. Heney not been shot in court during the trial. This may be partially true, though it is certain that the public and patriotism of the present governor of California was largely the cause of the shooting worked toward the administration of justice, then the suffering and injury it caused on the end mine were worth while. As a crime it was more tolerable but so dangerous to society as other times that were committed during the course of the prosecutions.

Jury tampering, bribery of witnesses, control of courts by private interests—these strike at the foundations of American institutions. The open shooting worked a quick but temporary awakening of the public mind. The exposure of these other secret crimes, committed by exceedingly clever and adroit criminals, worked toward a gradual but permanent awakening.

There are many honest citizens of California today supporting the new progressive administration who openly opposed the work of graft progressive administration who openly opposed the work of the graft prosecutions. These persons do not realize that their present mental and moral attitude toward the administration of public affairs is in large measure due to what they saw

and came to understand during the course of the graft prosecutions.

That is the point, Ruef goes to jail. It is right and just that he should go. But that fact in itself is not the real triumph of the right. Ruef will have been sent to jail by the court that freed Schmitz on a flimsy technicality and thereby freed Ruef from the penalty of imprisonment for a crime to which he had pleaded guilty.
