### SHIPMENTS OF MEDIUM WEIGHT HOGS BRING PRICES.

#### Farmers Overlooking Opportunities in Not Raising More Swine.

D. E. Meyers, buyer for Kiddle Bros. shipped one car of hogs from Imbler yesterday which were nice even 200-pound averages which always brings top prices in the Portland market. Mr. Meyers, in speaking of the hog market said that the supply of marketable stuff is running low. Extra big hogs are considerably less in price than the small average. He also said that the farmers should go into the hog business on a more extensive scale as this country is the natural home "of the hog" as only once in the history of this valley has there been any cholera and that in hogs that were shipped here. Never in the history of Wallawa county has there been a case of contagious disease among the swine.
