**UP-RIVER MINE IS SOLD**

**EASTERN MONEY REPORTED TO HAVE TAKEN IT OVER.**

Sixty-Five Thousand Said to Have Been Paid for It.

The Harney County News prints an article regarding up river mine transactions which cannot be corroborated today but is taken by mining men to have some foundation. It follows.

Word has just been received by Archie McGowan that the Grande Ronde Mining & Power Co., whose large property is located on the head of Grande Ronde river, about 25 miles northwest of Sumpter, has sold his entire interests to an eastern company for a consideration of \$65,000.

"This has been considered a valuable placer property, but it was discovered last summer that it would require a big investment to equip the mine on a profitable working basis. The purchasers have taken possession of the property and are now preparing to equip the same with modern machinery which will cost many thousands of dollars.

"Archie McGowan was one of the incorporators of the Grande Ronde company and owned a large interest in it. This company purchased the property about one and one-half years ago for \$10,000. S. W. Laythe, a resident of Harriman, Oregon, also owned a considerable interest in the company.
