SEEKS LIBRARY INDUCEMENT

CITY WILL MAKE AN EFFORT TO HAVE CARNEGIE ASSIST.

Believed Possible for Pendleton to accomplish the Feat.

According to the statements made by City School Superintendent J. S. Landers this morning, an effort is again being made in this city to secure a Carnegie library for Pendleton, says the Pendleton Live Wire.

It will be remembered that some four years ago, this question was brought up before the people of this city and on the plea that the money to be secured had been acquired in questionable ways, many prominent citizens of the city were not in favor of asking Mr. Carnegie for any funds at that time and finally the matter was dropped and the present library established.

According to the plans that are usually in vogue, should a Carnegie fund be secured for the building of a library, it will be necessary for the citizens of the city, acting through the city council, to pledge a sum equal to 10 per cent of the total outlay, to be expended annually in the keeping up and maintaining such an institution. The original amount was not less than \$20,000, which would mean \$2,000 a year for maintenance.

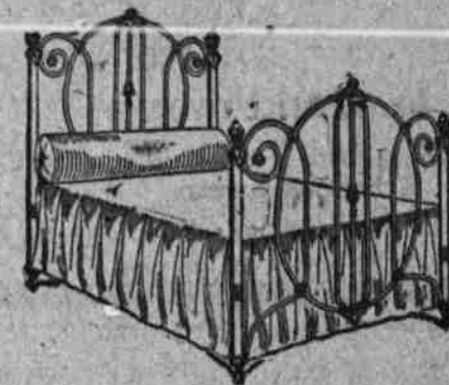

To Fruit Growers.
The fruit growers of Union county. The pruning season is now at hand so get your tools in shape and get at your pruning so as to get the brush out of the way ready for the winter spray. I also want to draw the attention of the people living in the city of La Grande that they must prune their shade trees, fruit trees, if any. That they must prune the same, and get their brush where it can be destroyed by fire within thirty days from the time of pruning. Parties owning ornamental trees or fruit trees will be compelled to spray said trees with a lime and sulphur spray. The state laws are very strict in regard to these matters and to protect the fruit industry of our valley these laws must be enforced. Any one needing pruning or spraying call on L. Stillwell, county fruit inspector.
