ACADEMY AFFAIRS SETTLED.

Institution at Pendleton Will Pay 50 Cents on the Dollar.

The affairs of the now defunct Pendleton academy may be settled out of court and the various creditors in this city may receive 50 cents on the dollar for their various claims, which amount in the aggregate to something like \$2,500 in the city of Pendleton, says the Live Wire.

Such in substance was the gist of the recommendations by the Commercial club last night to the board of trustees of the institution, after a statement had been made by Dr. C. J. Smith, one of the trustees, that the Presbyterian board, under whose control the institution was conducted, were willing to assume such an obligation, provided that a deed for the property be given by the present trustees and the matter be settled without a foreclosure suit in the circuit court.

Statements were made that the Presbyterian board, which is the national organization of that denomination, holds mortgages on the present property to the extent of \$14,000. For several years the institution was conducted at a loss and the board is not willing to advance further funds to conduct it. The Pendleton academy was first started here some 25 years ago and at various times the city of Pendleton has donated funds for its conduct, until an amount equal to \$20,000 has been contributed in various ways.

Should the board be willing to accept the overtures that will be made by the local board trustees, it is thought that Pendleton creditors will receive the amount mentioned above on all their claims, but should it be necessary to take the settlement into court and a foreclosure of the mortgage allowed, their claims would be settled for much less. The move is made simply to settle the debts and save Pendleton creditors as much as possible out of the wreck.

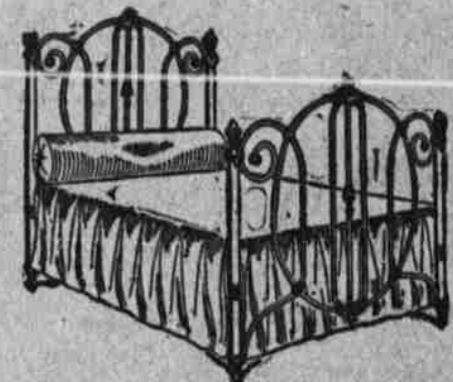
