TWO YEARS FOR LARCENY

TRIAL JURORS EXCUSED UNTIL MONDAY MORNING.

Several True Bills Have Been Returned the Past 24 Hours.

The first penitentiary sentence to be imposed this term came today when Judge Knowles gave G. W. Meuler two years in the state prison on the latter's plea of guilty to a charge of larceny from a dwelling.

Last night the grand jury reported a true bill against D. Walsh and Paul Coulten for larceny in a dwelling, committed at Union.

A true bill has been reported in the case of the state versus Kendall alleging forgery. The defendant pleaded not guilty.

The trial jurors have been excused until Monday though the grand jury is still at work.

RAINS CONTINUE IN SOUTH

LOSS ESTIMATED AT FIVE MILLIONS ALREADY.

Local People Have Money Interests in Big Flood District.

San Francisco, March 10.—Five millions is considered a conservative estimate today of the loss caused by the floods and storms which prevail in all parts of the state. More rains are predicted for tonight. The Santa Barbara district has lost a million, and rich bottom land has been swept into the sea. The flood loss in the vicinity of Los Angeles is severe to alfalfa and garden truck. Over \$100,000 has been lost in that department of farm life alone. Scores of houses are under water and several Southern Pacific bridges have gone out.

Mr. Casey has just finished filling a 500,000 feet lumber contract for the eastern market.
