PACIFIC CITIES CASE MONDAY

LA GRANDE'S INTERESTS INVOLVED ALONG WITH OTHERS.

Hearing Regarding Spokane Rate Case and Others Set for Monday.

Washington, March 15.—Such phases of the so-called Pacific coast cases as were not finally disposed of by the interstate commerce commission in its decision of last summer will come up for hearing before the commission in this city next Monday. The various cases involved in the proceeding will be those instituted by the city of Spokane, the Nevada state railroad commission, the Portland chamber of commerce, the transportation bureau of the Salt Lake city commercial club. As all of the cases involve interpretation and construction of the long and short haul provision of the existing law, the 13 applications made to the commission for relief from the operation of that provision in behalf of the transcontinental lines will be heard at the same time.

La Grande's rate case, being a part and parcel of the Spokane case, is also involved in this hearing next Monday. The local situation has been so arranged and involved that what benefits Spokane in this particular instance benefits La Grande. While this city is not mentioned in the titles of the case, the reading of the complaint is such that whatever Spokane gains will be enjoyed by La Grande as well.

For Investiture of Prince of Wales.

London, March 15.—The work of preparing Carnarvon castle for the investiture of the prince of Wales this summer is proceeding rapidly, and many additional workmen have now been employed. It is understood that the ceremony will take place in the upper courtyard on the site of the circle of stones put up for the national Welsh Eisteddfod held there five years ago. Several of the towers of the castle are being prepared for the accommodation of the royal family.

Tap Line Arguments Postponed.

Washington, March 15.—Arguments in the so-called "tap line" cases which were to have opened before the interstate commerce commission here today, have been postponed until next month. The cases are regarded as of the highest importance in railroad circles, as the question of what constitutes a common carrier and also the question of rebates are among the issues involved.
