METALIC PAVING IS NEEDED

OLD NEW YORK FINDS ALL OTH-
ER PROCESSES INADEQUATE.

Enormous Strain by Traffic Proves
Costly to City's Streets.

New York, March 15.—(Special)—
Confronted with an annual street re-
pair bill of nearly \$15,000,000, New
York may shortly become the first city
in the world to be paved with metal.
If plans now under consideration bear
fruit, while the streets will not be
of gold, even in the Wall street sec-
tion, it is expected that they soon will
consist of material never before used
for this purpose. Revolutionary as
the proposal to replace the present
pavements with metal may seem, it
is a matter which Father Knicker-
bocker must face seriously, since the
city today finds itself without an ade-
quate paving surface to meet its
needs. As a result it is estimated
that \$10,000,000 is needed to put the
streets of Manhattan borough alone
into proper condition, an amount that
not even the most liberal budget could
provide for a single year, let alone
annually. At present the sum of \$3-
000,000 is appropriated for street re-
pairs for all five boroughs. Large as
the sum is it is thoroughly inadequate
and the inability of the city to keep
its thoroughfare in order for this
amount has brought the conviction
that some new form of pavement is
necessary. The traffic of the city
has increased to an extent undreamed
of even ten years ago, chiefly because
of the automobile. In many of the
most congested spots vehicles now
pass a given point at the rate of four
a second or 240 a minute. The wear
on the streets has been further in-
creased by the presence of enormous
trucks, so that altogether, as is proven
by the present condition of the
streets, even Fifth avenue itself, the
equipment is far below the traffic
need. As metal seems to be the only
material to meet the requirements it
seems probable that New York will
soon have to adopt for the first time
in the history of the world this class
of pavement.

SIGNALS FOR ELECTRICS.

Indiana Imposes Rigid Laws to Elec-
tric Trains.

Chicago, March 15.—(Special)—
Electric as well as steam roads have
been included in Indiana in manda-
tory laws just passed requiring the
installation of signal equipment to
safeguard the movement of trains.
According to a bulletin of the League
for Public Safety in Chicago the road
which fails to install proper signal
equipment by January 1, 1912, will be
subject to a penalty of \$1,000 per
week. The railroad commission is
given authority to extend the time for
installation if good reason appears
and also to pass on the form of sig-
nals adopted, it being specified that
"any other form of block or other sig-
naling system now or hereafter devised
or used which shall reasonable
serve the safety of life and property,"
may be included under the statutory
requirement. This advanced legisla-
tion may be accepted as a model in
other states, and if it should be, the
steam and electric roads of the United
States would be compelled to in-
vest some \$300,000,000 in signal ap-
paratus. The enormous savings to
the railroads resulting from properly
safeguarded train movement as well
as the public need for protection to
life and property are the reasons
which caused the Indiana legislature
to enact this bill. Copies of the mea-
sure will be put in the hands of state
officials together with the reasons why
the measure should be generally
adopted.
