LOCAL PEOPLE INLAND EMPIRE BACK MINE CONFIDENT

GROUP OF LOSTINE MINES TO BE DEVELOPED.

Pete and Duncan McDonald and Angus Shaw Have Interest.

M. B. Runyon of Lostine is in the city. Mr. Runyan is taking care of the Athena group of mines 16 miles south of Lostine. This property is owned by John Froome of Athena, Duncan McDonald Pete McDonald of La Grande and Angus Shaw of Summerville. Arrangements are being made for development work to commence at once. The owners are figuring on putting in an electric power plant to operate the machinery necessary to make the Athena group a producer at once.

GRAINMEN, HAY MAKERS AND ORCHARDISTS OPTIMISTIC.

Hundred Million Dollar Crop is Anticipation This Year.

Spokane, Wash., March 16.—(Special)—Grain and hay ranchers, orchardists and truck gardeners all over the inland empire are looking forward this season to the largest crops in the history of the district, which means that the total market value of the cereals, grasses, vegetables and fruits will be a matter of more than \$100,000,000. It is estimated by the growers that of this amount fully \$15,000,000 will be their share from the apple crop alone.

Spring seeding and plowing is under way in the southern parts of the district and it is expected to begin work soon in the northern counties. No wheat is reported frozen out anywhere in the district, nor has there been any serious damage in the peach belts. In fact, United States weather bureau reports show the mercury did not reach the zero point at any time during the winter. There was sufficient snow to protect fall-sown grain and the thaws came at such times that the soil could absorb much of the moisture.

Orchardists in the irrigated districts report there is ample water for all requirements, notwithstanding the fact that thousands of acres of semi-humid lands have been put under the ditch during the last 12 months. The mountainous districts are full of snow thus also assuring ample moisture in the non-irrigated belts.

It is expected that several hundred thousand acres of lands will be settled during the year. Railway officials say more than 50,000 homeseekers will come into the country during the next 20 days. Those who have come so far are of the better class of settlers from central and eastern states. West bound trains on the transcontinental lines are being run in two and three sections, and it is given out at the Spokane offices that more trains could be run from points west of the Mississippi river if the equipment were available.

NEW COUNCIL IN SATURDAY

SPECIAL MEETING TO BE HELD ON THAT DATE.

Old Councilmen's Terms Expire Today and New Ones Take Oath

Dissolution of the old council and installation of the new law makers will take place next Saturday evening at a special meeting of the city council according to a decision reached last evening when the present council met to transact routine business. Considerable matters of importance were gone over and a few details will be cleaned up next Saturday evening, such as the final report on the peanut, hot tamale and popcorn license ordinances and a few other matters. The meeting whereat the new councilmen are to be seated was placed at Saturday evening on the opinion of City Attorney Cochran who found that while the terms of the retiring councilmen expired today, the 16th, the new councilmen could be seated at any time hereafter and Saturday was the most agreeable one to a majority. Councilman Logsden maintained stoutly that the meeting should be held next Monday according to the charter provisions but legal interpretation deemed any night after tonight a legal date.

However, Logsden gained his particular point by refusing to be present Saturday.
