TRAIN CREW IN FIGHT.

Haines Boys Figure in Fracas With Passenger Train Crew Last Week

John and Marion Pierce of Haines are now in the county jail awaiting the action of the grand jury. It is alleged that they assaulted the conductor and trainmen on No. 5 Friday night while they were attempting to beat their way to Haines. The train was stopped between here and Haines and the boys put off, and it was then that the trouble occurred.

F. E. Pierce, father of the boys, made the following statement to the Herald: "In regard to the row on the train I am informed by eye witnesses that my boys are a little to blame and the train crew are more to blame. I am informed that the boys started home Friday night, having 70 cents between them. One bought a ticket and the other tried to beat his way. The train was stopped and he was put off. Then he got on and paid the conductor the full fare of 30 cents, and the 10 cents extra. I don't believe my boys ought to be censured any more than the train crew."

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating Improvement District No. 2 and designating Main avenue, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 15th day of March, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Main avenue, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon bitulthic pavement, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of Main avenue, from the west side of 4th street, to the west side of First Street.
(A) And the property affected or

benefitted by said improvement is as follows:

All the property between the south from Fourth street west through the center of blocks 10 and 13 in Grandy's addition to La Grande, Oregon, to the center of block 2 in Romig's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon, and all the property between the north line of Main avenue and a line drawn from Fourth street west through the center of blocks 1, 9 and 14 in Grandy's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon, to the center of block 1 in Romig's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon.
