**LOCAL RADISHES ON MARKETS SOON.**

California radishes, now on the market, are to be displaced within a week by La Grande grown radishes according to the announcing of a local Chinese truck gardener who has the vegetable almost ready for the market. This will be the earliest marketing of local-grown radishes in the minds of local retailers and puts this city on a class with well known garden spots of the northwest. The radishes are grown out of doors and Mr. Chinaman asserts they will be high grade. Spring vegetables have been plentiful during the present month, though of course, all the various lines do not come from Walla Walla and therefore are showing slight traces of long shipment.

**Notice of Street Improvement.** To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating Improvement District No. 3 and designating Main avenue, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 15th day of March, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Main avenue, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon bitulthic pavement, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Main avenue from the west side of 4th street, to the west side of First Street.  
(A) And the property affected or benefitted by said improvement is as follows:  
All the property between the south line of Main avenue and a line drawn from Fourth street west through the center of blocks 10 and 13 in Grandy's addition to La Grande, Oregon, to the center of block 2 in Romig's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon, and all the property between the north line of Main avenue and a line drawn from Fourth street west through the center of blocks 1, 9 and 14 in Grandy's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon, to the center of block 1 in Romig's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefitted by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$12,250.00. That the council will on the 5th day of April, 1911, meet at the council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., to consider said estimated cost and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
