POSTPONE LAND OPENING

COLVILLE INDIAN RESERVATION SETTLED IN 1913.

Fred Dennett Announces Delay in Opening to Washington Parties.

Spokane, Wash., March 24.—(Special)—United States Senator Miles Poindexter, who is in Spokane assisting a citizens' committee in making arrangements for Colonel Theodore Roosevelt's visit here, April 7 to 9, has received official notice from Fred Dennett, commissioner of the general land office, that the Colville Indian reservation, (1,400,000 acres), will not be opened to settlement until 1913 or 12 months later than previously announced. The cause assigned is that the allotting agent cannot complete the Indian allotments for more than a year and the land office will require another year to arrange for the drawing. Replying to a petition presented through Mr. Poindexter on behalf of the people of Okanogan, Wash., that a new land district be established with that city as headquarters, Mr. Dennett said that the opening of the reserve would occasion such action, but even then it would not be justified, as the public land in northern Washington is fast disappearing through rapid settlement. This would indicate that Spokane will be the registry center in 1913.

SEVERAL DOGS IN POUND

WILL BE KILLED FOR NOT WEARING DOG TAXES.
