SHAM BATTLE AT PENDLETON

COMPANY AT THAT PLACE TO GO THROUGH MANEUVERS.

Miniature "Border Disturbances" Assigned for Work Tomorrow.

Pendleton will have the opportunity of watching Sunday morning maneuvers that have never before been executed in Oregon save only at the annual maneuvers of the national guard, says a Pendleton paper.

Company L will be divided into two half companies. Under Captain Ferguson one detachment will endeavor to capture the Indian agency building.

Under Lieutenant Vinler and Storey, the second detachment will be given half an hour's start from Pendleton. It orders will be simple and few. They are:

Must Hold Building.

"An attacking force will leave Pendleton in half an hour determined to capture the agency buildings. You are directed to occupy those buildings and to repulse the invading forces."

The "battle" will be spectacular in the extreme. Each man will be supplied with 50 rounds of ammunition (blank) and there is no telling what the slaughter will be.

There will be a certain amount of vim to the engagement, too, because the losing force will not have any lunch.

Prisoners Will Go Hungry.

Under charge of the commissary sergeant, the wagons will leave with defending forces. If the defenders are enabled to keep the invaders from entering the agency, the invading army will have to march back to Pendleton on empty stomachs. On the other hand, if the defending force is driven from the buildings, it will certainly be compelled to relinquish the food.

It has been agreed that prisoners of war shall not be fed, so it may be taken for granted there will not quarter shown on either side.

As a tactical problem, the maneuvers will be of absorbing interest. There is just enough timber and the ground is undulating enough to make the problem one of practical warfare.

Lieutenants Vinler and Storey will receive a practical lesson in defensive tactics.

Must Surprise Position.

It may be taken for granted that Captain Ferguson will not lead his men to the slaughter, so it will be up to the officers commanding the defending forces to so place their outposts that they are not surprised. From the lay of the land, it is practically certain that Captain Ferguson will place his hopes of capturing the most important strategical point in Umatilla county purely by craft. His force will hardly be large enough to carry the "fort" buildings by assault.

The tactical problem will be interesting enough to attract a large crowd of sightseers from Pendleton. However, Captain Ferguson makes no promise that he will not commandeer any vehicles for the use of the invaders.

Will Defend to Last Man.

"Whether Captain Ferguson represents an invading Japanese force or not, whether he is simply seeing how he can spy out Umatilla county, I want to assure him that it will be impossible for him to capture the Indian school," declared Lieutenant Vinler this morning. "We shall defend the position till every man is killed."
