**CONKLIN GOES TO
WALLOWA**

SEVERAL CONNECTIONS WITH THE
COVE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

After Building Up Schools at Fruit
Town, will Enter Sister County.

Prof. Roy Conklin, head of the public schools at Cove and owner of pure bred horses and a vice president in the Union Stock show association, will go to Wallowa next year. The Wallowa Sun reports:

Friday evening the board of directors met and elected Prof. Roy Conklin of Cove to succeed Prof. H. H. Bronson as principal of schools. At the same meeting Miss Anna Strong was re-elected assistant principal and Misses Etha Kiooch, Olga Post and Minnie M. Miller were retained in the first, first and second grades respectively. The positions in third, fourth, sixth and seventh grades are yet to fill.

Prof. H. H. Bronson who has had charge of the school for the past three years did not seek a re-election as the recent attack of pneumonia has warned him to seek a lower altitude and less rigid climate for the next year. He will secure a school in western Oregon for the next year.

Prof. Conklin, who has had charge of the Cove school for several years, is highly recommended as an instructor and disciplinarian. He has had excellent success in the school where he has been employed and has built up an attendance in the high school that proves his administrative ability beyond a doubt. Wallowa patrons are to be congratulated upon securing so valuable a man for the place.

MORELOCK AGAIN NOMINATED.

Only One Ticket in Field at Wallowa and Interest Not Keen.

At the caucus held Thursday night of last week J. P. Morelock was nominated to succeed himself as mayor of the city. Edwin Marvin was re-nominated for councilman and J. H. Minnaugh was named to succeed C. A. McClaran, according to the Wallowa Sun. J. C. Ban and E. L. Holmes declined the re-nomination for the offices of recorder and treasurer, respectively, and Bruce Cox was named for treasurer and F. T. Baker for recorder by acclamation. The ticket was nominated the Citizen's ticket.

There was no demand for city offices and the two salaried jobs went to the respective nominees without a vote. H. E. Driver was named for mayor but was defeated for the nomination by the present incumbent, T. E. Mitchell and T. C. Miller were in the race for places as councilmen but failed to get as many votes as the chairman thought necessary to entitle them to a place on the ticket.

Bruce Cox presided at the meeting and H. K. O'Brien acted as secretary.
