Changes in numbering engines have been ordered by O.-W. officials and within a short time there will be half dozen other engines here whose identity will be changed as far as th ir numbers are concerned. In addition to these changes the 205 will be put into the 300 class and the 211 will be changed to the 250 class at once. Local officials do not know the reason for the change.
