"The native people are interested in vegetable gardening and fowl raising. as both add to their food supply. At present the food is of the simplest sort, consisting of a round grain cooked to a stiff mush, and a little bit of weed leaves or a few beans cooked in water. During the past three years we have been working on the establishment of a course in agriculture. The work has progressed slowly, and we have had to feel our way, as there has been no previous experience by which we might be guided. The first year consists of judging and treating animals for the simple diseases and the breeding of sheep, goats, pigs and cattle. During the second year our work is devoted to the growing of farm crops, fruit culture and fowl raising."
