

STENCH ON 2ND NEW STALLION RELIEVED BOARD SITS

SECOND STREET AND N AVENUE
BOTH GET RELIEF.

High School Sewage No Longer Reaches
Street—Relief on Second.

Unsanitary conditions in West La Grande brought about by flagrant violations of rules of sanitation by residents on Second street who allowed sewage to be carried to the surface of the street pending the completion of the sewer project, and also on N avenue where sewage from the high school seeped out to the N avenue ditch and during school days made a small stream down as far as Eighth or Ninth streets, will be remedied immediately. Property owners on Second street are complying with the mandates of the city officials that the practice of the past week or two be dropped immediately, and the school board has taken steps to eliminate the unsanitary conditions along N avenue. The school board has ordered a cess pool dug at once and it will retain this sewage until the sewer is completed. The condition arose because the sewage from the new school building overtaxed the capacity of the cess pool used to retain the old building's sewage.

GOOD MEDALS HUNG UP

COUNTY TRACK AND FIELD MEET

MEETING HELD IN CORVALLIS
THIS MORNING

All Stallions Throughout the State
Must Be Registered.

Corvallis, Ore., April 12.—(Special.)—The new stallion registration board created by the recent legislature met at the Oregon Agricultural college to organize and plan the campaign for the betterment of horse breeding in Oregon. The board includes J. H. Booth of Roseburg, president of the state board of agriculture; W. H. Lytle of Pendleton, state veterinarian; Dr. James Withecombe, director of the Oregon experiment station; and Prof. E. L. Potter of the O. A. C. animal husbandry department, who was elected secretary.

The work of registering the stallions so that those who use them may know definitely whether their colts will be pure bred, cross bred or "scrubs," will be begun at once, and the board is preparing to issue such licenses immediately, as the law goes into effect the last day of May.

It is a notable fact that the text of the stallion law was drawn by the students of the college department of animal husbandry; an indication of the truly practical nature of the instruction given.

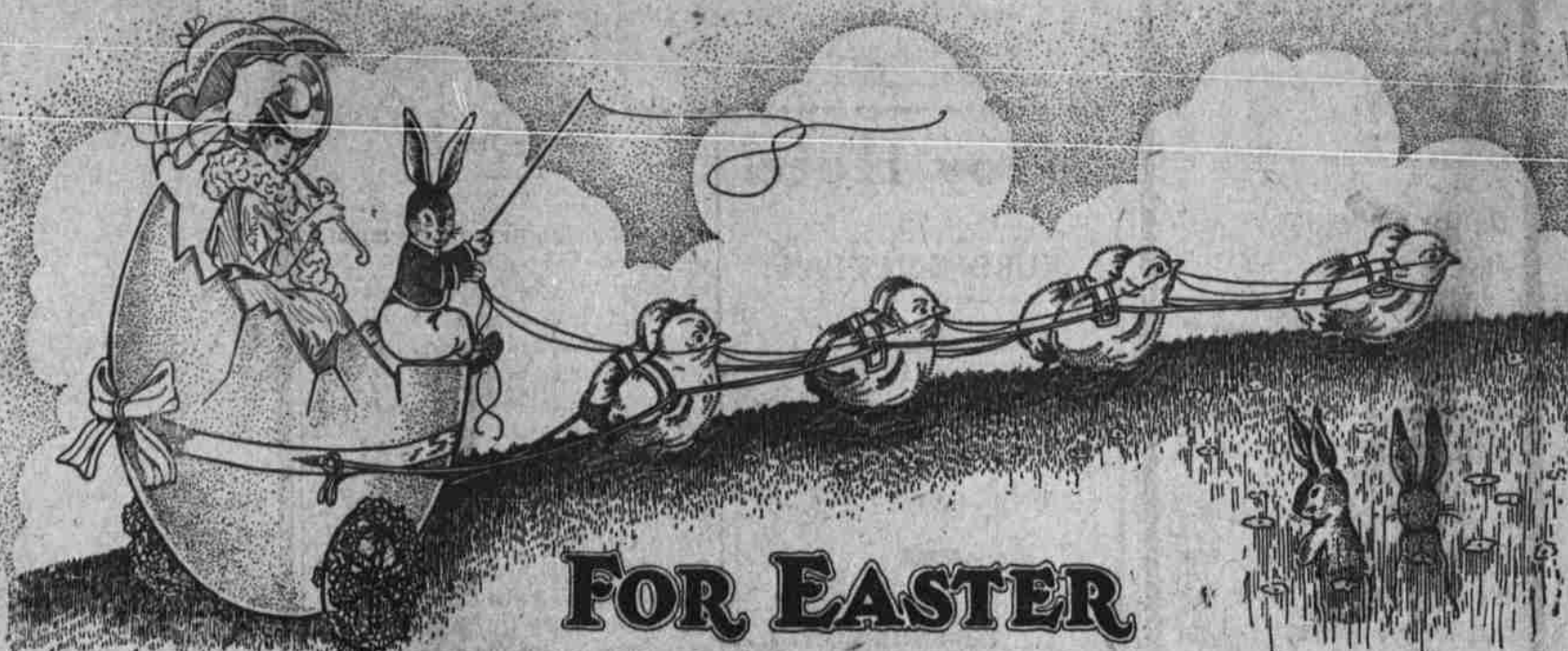

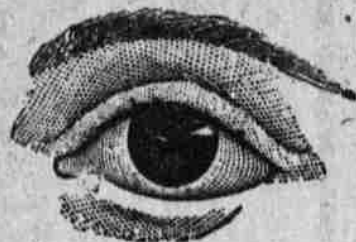

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 1st day of December, 1909, creating Improvement district No. 9 and designating Fourth street as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the first day of February, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Fourth street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon macadam, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:
All that portion of Fourth street,

from the south side of O avenue, to the north side of C avenue.
