FIVE TO ONE IS SCORE OF FIVE-INNING GAME.

Kellum on the Mound for City Team Blythstone for Stars.

With a nucleus of the La Grande team that is to be pitted against Pidecock's All-Stars yesterday afternoon, a five inning practice game was indulged in for the mutual benefit of the two teams. The regulars won, five to one.

Kellum, a local barber, was on the mound for the city team and though he is suffering from a badly sprained knee of a week ago, had the All-Stars pretty much at his mercy. Kellum is also an infielder. Hughes, the receiver, was out and worked like a clock and Wallace Childers, Captain Bradley at short and second respectively, Proe in center, Cotner in left and H. Ath in right, with a substitute from the All-Stars on first and Henderson, a lumber grader, who, by the way, leaves La Grande soon, on third constituted the city team lineup. Blythstone and Pidecock made up the battery for the All-Stars. The work-out was a good one and displayed that the old standbys are in good trim for the opening game next Sunday at Baker. The city team will practice each evening hereafter during the week.

To whom it may concern: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 1st day of December, 1909, creating Improvement district No. 9 and designating Fourth street as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the first day of February, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Fourth street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described by laying thereon macadam, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefitted by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Fourth street, from the south side of O venue, to the north side of C avenue.

(A) And the property affected or benefitted by said improvement is as follows: All the property between the west line of Fourth street and a line drawn from O avenue, south through the center of blocks 74, 75, and the block used by school district No. 1, and block 88, 89 and 96, Chaplin's addition and block 11, 10 and 1, Arnolds & Drays addition and blocks 5 and 4, Arnolds addition and block 4-B-st., original town of La Grande, and all the property between the east line of Fourth street and the west line of Fifth street, including all of blocks 59, 58, 51, 50, 41, 40; 31; 30; 21; 20; 11 and 10, Chaplin's addition, all being in the city of La Grande, Union county, Oregon.

Notice is hereby further given that the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefitted by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$15,070.00. That the council will on the 19th day of April, 1911, meet at the council chamber at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., to consider said estimated cost, and the levy of said assessment, when a hearing will be granted to any person feeling aggrieved by such assessment.
